Graduation Requirement Change

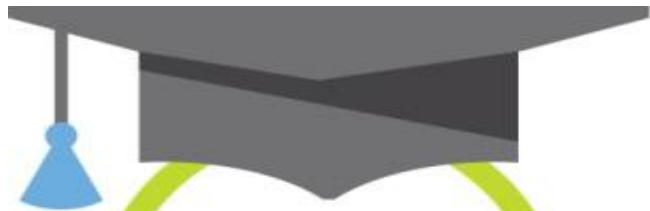
Instead of passing a high school graduation test (OGT), Ohio law now requires that students demonstrate college and career readiness



Brief History of New Tests

- 2014-2015--students need to complete end-of-course exams in 10 subjects
 - PARCC and AIR tests
 - Reduced to 7 subjects
 - EOC could be used in place of final exams
- 2015-2016--new AIR tests
- 2016-2017--continue AIR tests and an official ACT or SAT to juniors

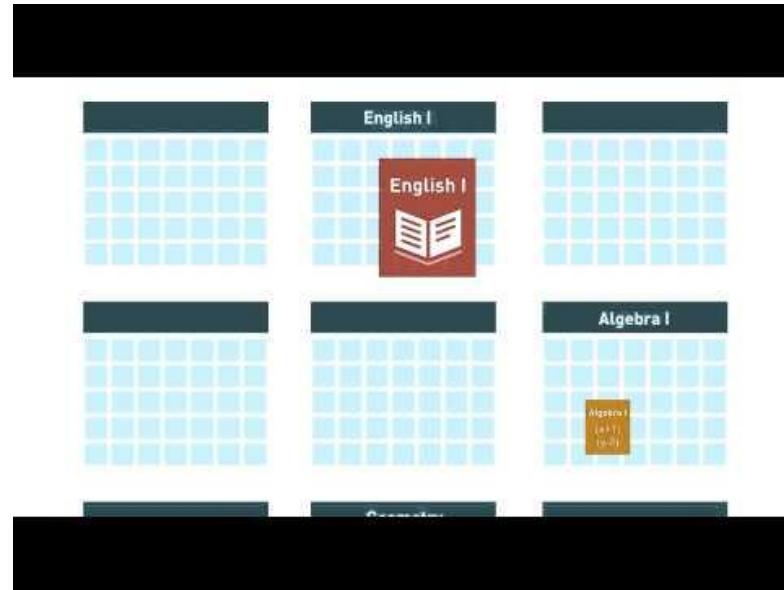

Ohio law created three options for students to earn a diploma

2. Three Graduation Options



At least 18 points on state tests



Industry-approved credential and a work-readiness score on WorkKeys



Remediation-free score on ACT or SAT



Three Graduation Options



At least 18 points on state tests



Earn a minimum of **four points** in English tests

Earn a minimum of **four points** in math tests

Earn a minimum of **six points** in science and social studies tests

Additional **four points** selected from any of the content areas



Class of 2018: Earn 18 points on state tests

1. English I
2. English II



3. Algebra I or Int. Math I
4. Geometry or Int. Math II



5. Biology or Physical Science
6. American History
7. American Government



Class of 2019 and Beyond: Earn 18 points on state tests

1. English I
2. English II



3. Algebra I or Int. Math I
4. Geometry or Int. Math II



5. Biology
6. American History
7. American Government



Exception for Class of 2018

- During 2014-2015, students in the class of 2018 not on state scholarships were able to use their course grades in place of test points
- $A = 5$, $B = 4$, $C = 3$, $D = 2$, $F = 0$



Exception for Class of 2018

- Students in the class of 2018 who were on state scholarships (EdChoice, Jon Peterson, and Autism) must take the state tests to earn points
- State scholarship students are not able to use course grade equivalents

Three Graduation Options



Remediation-free score on ACT or SAT



Remediation-Free Score

Earn the “remediation-free” scores* on either college and career readiness test:

ACT

English	18 or higher
Mathematics	22 or higher
Reading	22 or higher

SAT

Writing	430 or higher
Mathematics	520 or higher
Reading	450 or higher

**Ohio’s university presidents set these scores, which are subject to change.*



ACT for Juniors

- All juniors will take an ACT test for free on March 21, 2017
- This is a real ACT which can be used for college admissions
- Does not include writing portion



Iowa E Assessment

- Recently approved by ODE as an alternative assessment for graduation
- Created by same company of the Iowa tests used in many Catholic elementary schools



Next Steps

1. Look into Iowa E Assessment
2. Review student points and determine best course of action for each student
3. Continue to strengthen ACT preparation
